Day Porto and its Confectionery

In the morning, a visit to Porto's historic center, visiting various traditional confectioneries and pastry shops, centuries-old shops, and where convent sweets are showcased.

Lunch at a Typical and Traditional Restaurant, for an intimate experience with the cuisine of the North Region and a convent dessert.


In the afternoon, a visit to the iconic Café Majestic, an icon of the Belle Époque, to taste traditional sweets.

Tour of the historic center and tasting of the famous pastel de nata, another icon of Portugueseconvent sweets.

Return to the Hotel Palácio do Freixo, a beautiful hotel in Porto near the Douro River.







Day Amarante Region Resende and Arouca

Departure from Porto to Amarante.

Visit the historic center and taste local convent sweets (Papos de Anjo, Brisas do Tâmega).

Lunch: Regional meal in Amarante, with regional and convent desserts.

Afternoon: Visit to Resende, famous for its Conventual Cavacas de Resende.

Arrival in Arouca, visit the historic center and the region's convent sweets (Barrigas de Freira, Beijos de Freira, Castanhas Doces).

Dinner & overnight at the beautiful MS Collection hotel in the Monastery/ Convent of Arouca, with dinner and convent desserts.





Day Vale Cambra Region Vila da Feira and Aveiro

Departure from Arouca and travel to Vale de Cambra, stroll through the center and visit to a Cambrinhas confectionery, a regional and convent sweet.

Lunch in Vila da Feira, visit the emblematic castle and a regional lunch of medieval tradition, with a convent dessert.

Departure towards Aveiro, visit the beautiful historic center and visit the confectionery to enjoy Aveio's most characteristic convent sweet, Ovos Moles.

Possibility of visiting the salt pans and a ride on a moliceiro, a traditional estuary boat, if conditions permit (optional).

Dinner and overnight stay at the Hotel MS Collection with a regional menu.





Morning: Travel to the city of Tentúgal.

Visit a traditional pastry shop to taste the legendary Tentúgal Pastries.

Lunch in Coimbra, with the city's traditional desserts (Arrufadas, Barrigas de Freira), in a typical and regional restaurant.

Brief tour of Coimbra's historic center, with a visit to the Convent of Santa Clara.

Also visit Quinta das Lágrimas, whose romantic gardens have inspired artists and writers.

Return to Porto.

This playbook celebrates the centuries-old tradition of monasteries and convents, the regional gastronomy, and the cultural landscape of Northern Portugal, transforming each sweet into a historical and sensory experience.

Playbook – 4-Day Itinerary through Northern Portugal's Conventual Sweets

Day 1 – Porto: Sweets, History, and Tradition

Morning - Tour of Porto's historic center with visits to traditional confectioneries, iconic bakeries, and centuries-old shops dedicated to convent sweets.

Lunch - Meal at a typical northern restaurant, accompanied by a convent dessert.

Afternoon - Visit Café Majestic, an icon of the Belle Époque, to taste traditional sweets.

Tasting of pastel de nata, the most iconic Portuguese convent sweets.

Lodging at Palácio do Freixo, a landmark in Porto's hotel industry near the Douro River.

Day 2 – Amarante, Resende & Arouca

Morning - Departure for Amarante, visit the historic center, and taste convent sweets: Papos de Anjo, Brisas do Tâmega.

Lunch - Regional meal in Amarante, with convent desserts.

Afternoon - Visit to Resende, famous for its convent cavacas (sweet sweets).

Arrival in Arouca, visit the historic center and taste local convent sweets: Nun's Barrigas (barrigas de nureira), Nun's Kisses (beijos de nureira), and sweet chestnuts.

Dinner & Accommodation at MS Collection Arouca Monastery, with dinner and convent desserts.

Day 3 – Vale de Cambra, Feira & Aveiro

Morning - Departure for Vale de Cambra, visit the city center, and taste the traditional Cambrinhas.

Lunch - In Santa Maria da Feira, visit the castle and enjoy a medieval-inspired regional lunch with a convent dessert.

Afternoon - Arrival in Aveiro: tour of the historic center, taste the famous Ovos Moles (soft eggs) and visit a traditional pastry shop.

Optional: visit the salt pans and a moliceiro boat ride on the estuary.

Dinner & Accommodation at MS Collection Aveiro, with a regional dinner.

Day 4 – Tentúgal & Coimbra Porto

Morning - Travel to Tentúgal, visit the traditional pastry shop, and taste the legendary Pastéis de Tentúgal.

Lunch - In Coimbra, a typical meal with local convent desserts: Arrufadas (Brazilian sweets) and Barrigas de Freira (Nun's Bars).

Afternoon - Stroll through the historic center, visit the Santa Clara Convent and the romantic gardens of Quinta das Lágrimas, an inspiration for artists and poets.

Return to Porto.
